Title: Rate Increases

Recommended Action: Approval or Direction

Analysis

The Harbormaster and Marina Manager are suggesting a 3% rate increase for long term and short term tenants with the exception of the commercial fishing fleet. Rates would increase as follows.

The Harbor District has been implementing an annual rate increase on all vessels except commercial fishing vessels for the last 3 years. Rate increases help balance the annual budgets and prevent larger rate increases at one time.

Fiscal Impacts

The 2025-2026 budget expects the Harbor District to make \$60,000 on short term rentals. A 3% increase across the board should increase District revenues to \$61,800 annually.

Long term rentals revenues would also increase to an estimated \$426,000 annually.

Title: Sediment Cell Grants
Recommended Action: Approval or Direction

Analysis

The Harbormaster has been trying to work with the City of Fort Bragg on a partnership for the sediment containment cell project. Despite interest being expressed from the City side, little movement has been made. The Harbormaster has also received feedback from EDA that they will only fund up to 30% design and permitting work in the first round of a planning and construction project. After reviewing this with SHN, the Harbormaster and SHN have developed a 2 year timeline to complete the necessary studies and initial construction plans for the redevelopment of the cell. Overall, this project is budget to cost \$450,000 and require a \$112,500 match. While the City is still expressing interest in helping with the match the Harbormaster would like to move forward without a formal commitment from the City.

The Harbormaster has also identified some state funds from the California Department of Boating and Waterways that may work as match. Although the sediment cell is very different from the normal types of projects this funding source usually covers. The CDBW funding source for Public Beach Restoration and Shoreline Erosion Programs. The reduction in size of the cell could meet the public beach restoration program requirements.

In kind matches can also be used for matches and staff time is considered to be an in-kind match.

Fiscal Impacts

If funded an no other matches are identified, the District would need to acquire a \$112,500 loan or use funds from their reserves.

Title: Asbestos and lead Removal

Recommended Action: Approval or Direction

Analysis

The Marina Manager has been working to find a company that can handle the lead and asbestos that is still present on Miss Smith, Empress and Captain Cook. Cal Inc has presented the most reasonable quote of all the companies that have been contacted. The majority of companies that responded to the request for help wanted to abate the entire vessel, rather than focus on just the hazmat issues. As the District has experienced in the past, abatement of the entire vessels is best left to the District and District staff.

These three vessels are the last of the large vessels proposed to be removed in the deferred maintenance project proposed in June of 2025.

Overall, the commission allocated \$70,000 for the removal and abatement of abandoned and derelict vessels that do not fall under the SAVE grant reimbursements requirements. Thus far 6 vessels have been abated with harbor district funds totaling to \$13,715.83 in expenses directly billed to the District. If the commission were to accept the Cal Inc proposal the Harbormaster and Marina Manager have estimated the total bill to be \$34,532 in hazardous materials removal. This would leave an additional \$21,753 for the removal and abatement of the vessels.

This amount seems very reasonable for the final abatement of the last three vessels, given that the District has already abated 6 vessels for just shy of \$14,000.

Fiscal Impacts

Empress and Captain Cook are the two largest vessels in the abatement program and are taking up two 50ft spots in the marina. These slips cost roughly \$3,000-\$4,000 annually in slip rental fees, and the District will eventually make up the cost of the abatement projects.

As with all abatement projects there is a gamble to leaving the vessels in the water to long and having them sink at the dock causing a slew of more issues and requiring more funds to raise the vessel before they can be abated.

Pricing is based entirely upon the scope of work described below. Any changes to the scope or terms and conditions may result in price modifications.

GENERAL SCOPE OF WORK

Project Overview: CAL INC, a licensed and certified asbestos and demolition contractor, proposes to provide all necessary labor, materials, equipment, and supervision required to perform the removal and proper disposal of designated items as described in the Scope of Work. All work will be conducted in strict accordance with applicable local, state, and federal regulations, including Cal/OSHA, EPA, and DTSC requirements where applicable.

Scope of Work: CAL INC to provide lead paint stabilization on three boat which have been described in photos sent on 11-4-25.

Lead paint stabilization consists of removing loose and peeling paint prior to demolition. CAL INC crew will lay poly on the ground and proceed to remove loose and peeling paint with hand tools such that the remaining paint on the boats will be intact.

Once stabilization has been completed, the customer may proceed with demolishing and disposing of the boats.

Bid assumes that the three boats will be out of the water and made accessible to our crews such that we can reach all areas of the boats.

Based on the size and condition of the boats we are estimating 3-4 days per boat to complete the stabilization process.

Final billing will be based on the number of days on site.

Bid also includes the transportation and disposal of lead waste generated by the stabilization process.

Removal Activities: CAL INC will remove and dispose of the specified materials, as outlined in the specifications and plan sheets referenced above, using hand tools and approved demolition equipment. All work will be performed in a way that minimizes dust and prevents the release of hazardous fibbers or particles.

Handling and Disposal: Waste will be transported to an approved disposal or recycling facility by licensed haulers. CAL INC will maintain full documentation of waste manifests and disposal certificates for submission to the client upon project completion.

Health & Safety: CAL INC will follow a site-specific Health and Safety Plan (HASP), which includes appropriate PPE, decontamination procedures, and air monitoring where applicable. All work will be performed by trained and certified personnel under the supervision of a competent person in accordance with regulatory standards.

Analysis

The issue of the Harbor District's insurance policy has been brough up recently after a non- insured vessel caused damaged to an insured vessel within the marina. While the two parties are working it out between themselves, the Harbor commission should take this opportunity to discuss the non-enforced insurance policy.

The Harbormaster had a quick conversation with their insurance agent Mike Hall and learned the following.

- By having a policy and not enforcing it, the District would then be liable for any damages, as they have knowingly let in a non-insured boater.
- Any vessel can get liability insurance, at the very least. The largest issue is cost. Some vessel owners may be taking advantage of the District's non-implementation to save on insurance fee's, while others are paying.
- In the past the Harbor charged boats for not having insurance, however this was misunderstood by the vessel owners, who thought the Harbor District was insuring them. This opens the District to a significant amount of liability. If the Harbor fee's boater for not having insurance, they also need to have any vessel owned charged with that fee sign a waiver stating they understand it is a penalty.

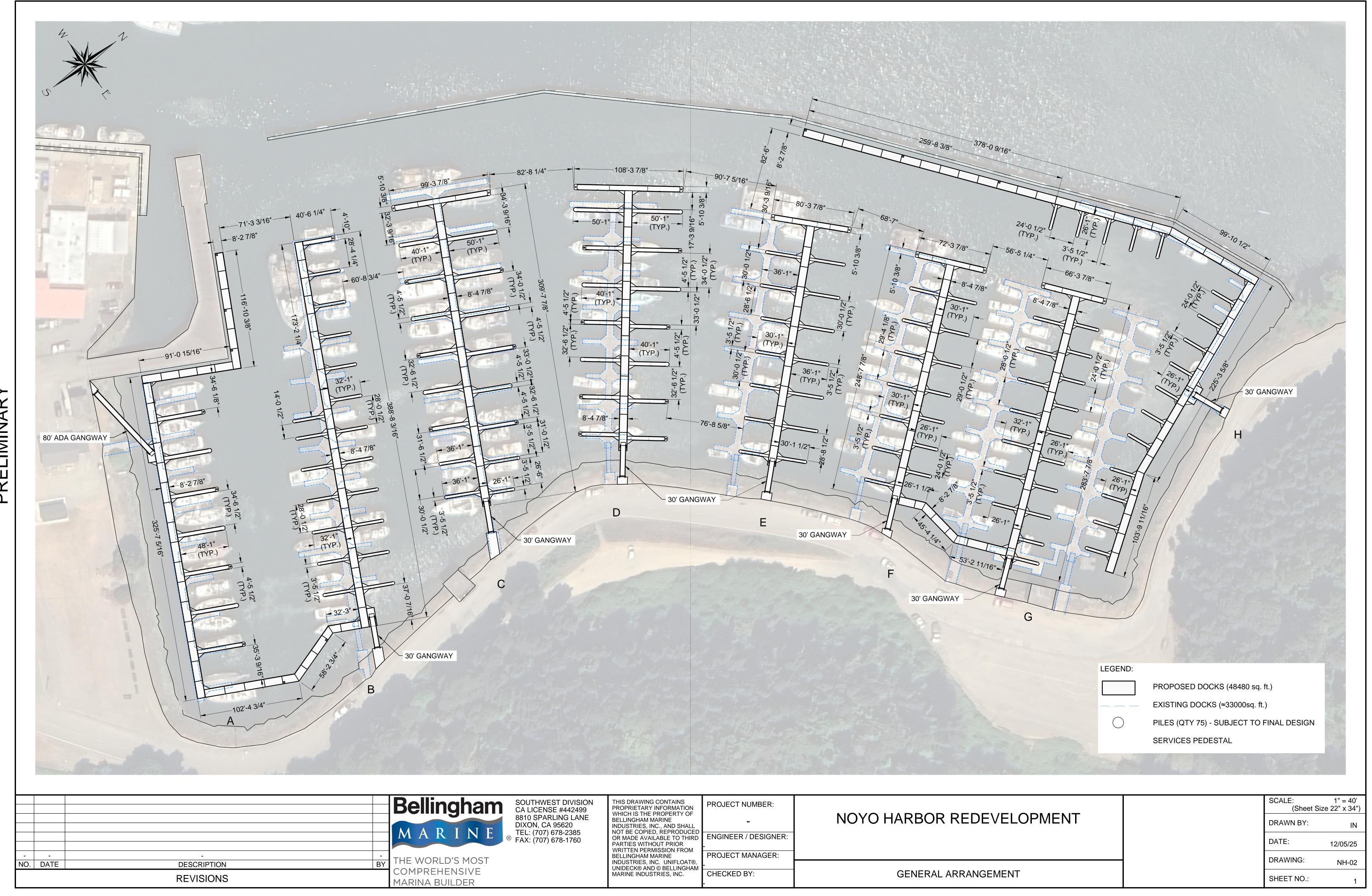
